

Five Pedal Tulips

Materials

2x2x4 inch hardwood block

Pipe cleaner

Bar-B-Que skewer

Tools

“ Tools

- . Bowl Gouge
- . Skew
- . 7/8 Forstner drill bit
- . Small Hollowing Tools
- . Paints, dyes, coloring agents, spray laquer

Five Pedal Tulips

- ” Mount block in 4 jaw chuck
- ” Turn round and make basic shape
- ” Drill $7/8^{\text{th}}$ hole 2-2.5 deep
- ” Hollow



- ” Define outside shape to make the piece between $3/32^{\text{nds}}$ and $1/8^{\text{th}}$ wall thickness
- ” Sand inside piece

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- “ Mark the five pedal tips



- “ Measure 1 and 2 inches from the open end and make circles
- “ Draw 5 horizontal line from the open end the length of the piece
- “ The ring closest to the opening split the difference of the petal tip line
- “ Draw petal tips to this point making a curved line
- “ Draw a line from where the pedal lines converge to the next ring line
- “ With a coping saw with a fine blade cut the pedal shape and to the base line

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- “ Use cloth backed sand paper sand the pedals then sand your lines away
- “ Finish turning the bottom shape, sand, add color and part off
- “ Drill a 1/16 hole through the bottom then drill an 1/8 hole about 1/4 - 5/16 deep
- “ Insert a piece of pipe cleaner in from the bottom then push in the skewer

Chrysanthemum

Materials

Branch of a tree $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{3}{4}$ diameter 6 " long

Color markers

Place branch in a chuck

Skew off the bark

Using the heel of the skew on the tip of the stick quickly stroke it back towards the chuck about $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch several times until you have reached the center of the stick

Color and part off
